

Twice Nobel Prize Winner, Dr. Compton Speaks March 11 at Unity Program

Dr. Arthur H. Compton, one of the five greatest living scientists, and the only man to receive the Nobel Prize in physics twice, will lecture on "Science, Religion, and National Unity" Tuesday, March 11, at 12 o'clock in the Main Lounge of the Texas Union. His appearance, under the auspices of the Austin round table of the National Conference of Christians and Jews, will be the outstanding event of the coming Brotherhood Day program to further national unity.

The program, which promises to be a significant, community-wide event, is expected to receive a 100 per cent representation of campus and civic organizations. Mayor Tom Miller, Dr. H. J. Ettlinger, professor of pure mathematics, and John Peninger, local businessman, will appear on a broadcast over KNOW Tuesday night at 8:15 o'clock to discuss the background of the program.

Dr. Compton, who is the protestant co-chairman of the national conference, is deeply interested in safeguarding national unity along religious lines. The conference, of which Justice Charles

Evans Hughes is chairman and the only living founder, originated the idea of the Brotherhood Day programs.

Dr. Compton obtained his master of arts and doctor of philosophy degrees from Princeton Graduate College, concluding his studies in 1916. After teaching at the University of Minnesota, he spent two years as research physicist with the Westinghouse Lamp Company, and one year as a signal corps expert during the first World War. He later studied a short while at Cambridge University, and then headed the physics department of Washington University.

He has also received the Rumford gold medal from the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, and another from the Radiological Society of North America. He is at present a professor of physics at the University of Chicago.
