Feb 9, 1915 Donald celebrated his birthday. Cake, ice cream, & real candles on cake. Clarence here.

Feb 10, 1917 Our boys lost another game.

" 11, 1919 Dolores sick - Don Rio here all day.

1916 Feb 12 Took long walk with Donald. He took care of me - found best paths, helped thru fences, etc.

Feb 12, 1917 Inst. beat X team.

Feb 14, 1918 men (of San Germain) gave Will nearly \$800 toward auto to begin island campaign.

Feb 17, 1919 Cistern dry! Gypsies pups arrived.

Feb 19, 1917 Mrs. Lopez Diaz here for day - also old man who ran over Dona G.

Feb 19, 1919 Washed for first time at new house.

Feb 20, 1918 Fine school parade. Food conservation idea. We do not have too much food in P. R. but we must conserve it.

Feb 22, 1917 "Birthington's Wash Day" to quote
