stood yet in English. Ever
since I left New York three
years ago, I have not heard
much of my dear old Polly
Hills. So I am beginning to feel
kind of lonesome for some time.

Your children must all be
grown up and some must have
gone through school already.
Is Dr. Harris working still hard
for the Institute? Are you all
happy and healthy?

Mrs. and Mr. Clarence
must have already children
of school age. How I would
like to see everybody and every-

thing again. I would like to be able to correspond with Maria but she does not care to.

I married a German in New York about four years ago. After six months we went to live in Costa Rica. We were making out good in farming, but my husband, Erich, took seriously sick and we were forced to come to Germany since now. Last year. However Costa Rica is a country around seven times the size of Porto Rico with a population of only half a million, which makes it possible for one not to starve there. We are now on our way back. We left Germany on the 31st of March. but we have yet ten more days to go.

I am enclosing a picture of Erich, our child and I. The other ladies are Erich's mother and sister. Our child, Hermann, was seventeen months old. If our good luck in business does not desert us Hermann will prefer to have a sister too.

Conditions in Germany are not so desperately hopeless as pictured abroad. I am not a good Hitlerist but God knows if Hitler is not the right man now.

I think that even you are glad to hear that I have changed my first name. Erich disliked it as much as I hated it, so I am known now only for Rita after his wishes.


I always remember that when I worked
 there as assistant ⁱⁿ motion, I asked
 Dr. Harris, make Randy call me his
 friend too. The sound of my name made
 me nervous, and I preferred to put
 myself in ridicule than to hear it.
 Should you be unable to write me,
 couldn't you have the secretary send

 I would be delighted to hear from you
