Dear Dr. Harris:

In accordance with your request, below is a narrative report of complete physical examination performed in March, 1955.

You were first seen by me on March 5, 1955, at which time you were hospitalized with the following complaints:

- (1). Marked dizziness - 2 days.
- (2). Slight nausea - 1 day.
- (3). Pain & tightness across chest - 1 or 2 days.

History revealed that you were well previous to the two or three days before admission, at which time you were involved in an incident in which you became emotionally disturbed. Following this the above symptoms occurred. It was your opinion at that time that your emotional disturbance caused the above symptoms. Remainder of the history was essentially negative. Physical examination revealed a 79 year old, well developed, well nourished white male who did not appear acutely ill. Temperature was 98.6°, pulse 80, and respirations 20. Blood pressure was 120/70. Examination was essentially negative except for the bigeminus rhythm noted on cardiac auscultation. During your hospitalization period the following work-up was done.

(1). Laboratory

- a. Serology - negative.
- b. Complete blood count - RBC 5,080,000
15.2 gms Hb., WBC 7,850, Differential-
Eosins-2, Stabs 1, Segs. 65, Lymphs 29,
Monos. 3.
- c. Urinalysis - negative.
- d. Sedimentation Rate - 24 mm. at end of
one hour.

(2). Electrocardiogram

March 5 & 7, 1955 - Bigeminus rhythm. The impulse originating in the S-A node.

No other abnormality was noted.

Upper gastro-intestinal series was done which revealed an active pre-pyloric ulcer. Chest x-ray was taken and was found to be essentially negative.

You were discharged from the Dilley Clinic Hospital on March 5, 1955, with the following diagnosis:

- (1). Vertigo, cause
 - a. Emotional
 - b. Cerebral arteriosclerosis.
- (2). Bigeminy rhythm originating in the S-A node.
- (3). Active pre-pyloric ulcer.

You were discharged on a peptic ulcer regime.

On April 16, 1955, repeat of the upper gastro-intestinal series revealed that the ulcer had completely healed and the entire examination was essentially negative.
